



Promise for Tomorrow Scholarships

Principles Governing Promise for Tomorrow Scholarship Awards

- Assist students who manifest need.
- Assist students who are serving the Church within the Archdiocese of Boston in parishes, schools, or other ministries.
- Assist students active in the Archdiocese of Boston who show promise in the New Evangelization
- Provide help especially to students working in geographical, ministerial, and/or cultural areas that the society underserves.
- Award two merit based scholarships (40% tuition remission) for graduate programs in order to attract well-qualified students to the formation provided by the Theological Institute for the New Evangelization (TI):
 - "Outstanding Lay Parish Service Scholarship" (Master of Arts in Ministry degree)
 - "New Evangelization Scholarship" (Master of Theological Studies degree)
- Support both degree-program candidates and non-degree/Certificate students.
- Continue to fund students at the same level of support until they complete their degrees
 - Students must maintain a suitable GPA and demonstrate continued financial need.
- Consider also those students who receive other scholarships or have other means of financial support.

Procedure

1. Go to <http://www.theologicalinstitute.org> and click on: Scholarships.
2. Download a PFT Scholarship application for either a graduate class or a Certificate.
3. Mail the application with a paper copy of the appropriate year's [FAFSA](#) along with a letter of recommendation from your pastor (or head of campus ministry or shrine) to:

PLEASE NOTE that the Promise for Tomorrow Scholarship Committee has indicated for future notice that it will begin to compare how many courses students indicate that they intended to take in a prior year's application and actually did pursue during the following academic year. The PFT Committee expects that all students will be as realistic as possible about their course projections on their applications. The PFT Committee commits funds to students based on financial need. If any student or group of students inflates the amount of courses that they intend to take but, in reality, do not, then the PFT Committee is unable to award that scholarship money associated with inflated course projections to other students in dire financial need for tuition assistance.

ALSO, Additionally for any and all future reapplication scholarship assistance, the PFT Committee requests that students send a letter of explanation if they did not use any of the prior academic year's scholarship award.

Deadlines:

Students must submit application on or before the following dates:

Summer and Early Fall scholarships: February 1, 2018

Late fall scholarships: May 1, 2018

(Please note that the PFT Committee may not be able to grant as many scholarships for disbursement for the late fall deadline.)
